Annual Report 2019

Aims Accumulation of scientific knowledge on happiness.

Approach

- Gathering *all* the empirical research findings on happiness and presenting these in an easy to overview standardized way.
- Updating this collection continuously, thus providing a basis for ongoing research synthesis.

Technique

Findings are described in a standard format and terminology on electronic *finding pages*. These pages are stored in an online *findings-archive* where they can be selected and sorted in various ways.

The technique allows for a new way of research reviewing, in which links to online pages with full detail are used.
